The 2012 Washington, DC, conference is going to be great! We are putting together an interesting and diverse program that features unprecedented participation from practitioners in the business community, from governments and from NGOs. We're looking forward to generating some stimulating and thought-provoking discussions and to creating exciting opportunities for networking.

We received more than 1100 submissions this year, including manuscripts and panels by authors from 67 countries. Submissions were spread across 11 regular tracks and two special tracks. While impossible to highlight all interesting conference activities here, I would like to call your attention to the following special events:

- **Junior Faculty Consortium**, chaired by John Mezias, Saturday, June 30.
- **Doctoral Student Consortium**, chaired by Sumit Kundu, Saturday, June 30.
- JIBS Paper Development Workshop, Saturday, June 30. The Ninth Annual JIBS PDW is coordinated by Petra Christmann and John Cantwell. Its purpose is to provide junior scholars with developmental feedback on their current research projects in international business studies. It is the most extensive outreach initiative of JIBS in collaboration with AIB.
- "DC Panels" DC Deans and Joint AIB-IMD Ambassadors Panel. In two separate
 "DC panels," Deans from several DC-Area business schools will meet to discuss IB

- research and a panel of DC-based Ambassadors will share their thoughts on the importance of institutions and good governance in their home countries. I would like to thank Jennifer Spencer, Liesl Riddle and the IB group at George Washington University for taking the time to organize the Ambassadors Panel.
- JIBS Decade Award session. The winner for this year's JIBS Decade Award is Keith Brouthers for his 2001 JIBS article: "Institutional, cultural and transaction cost influences on entry mode choice and performance." This session, tentatively scheduled for July 3rd, is dedicated to honoring Keith's work, and the commentators for this session are: Xavier Martin and Myles Shaver.
- Farmer Dissertation Session. This session includes presentations by the finalists for the Richard N. Farmer Best Dissertation Award. This year's selection committee is chaired by Mike Peng.
- Three WAIB sponsored panels including: "Diversity, East and West: A Profit and Non-profit Perspective of Women in International Business," "Women Starting and Leading Businesses in Adverse Conditions," and "Government Role in Promoting International Business: Maintaining Good Business-Government Relationships."

My sincere thanks to all track chairs (Preet Aulakh, David Berg, Harry Bowen, Charles Dhanaraj, Nigel Driffield, Arie Lewin, Patricia McDougall, Ram Mudambi,

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Anu Phene, Saeed Samiee, Jaeyong Song, Laszlo Tihanyi, Dave Thomas, Paul Vaaler and Bennet Zelner) as well as all authors and reviewers for their hard work in putting together such a high quality conference program.

Meeting Venue

The AIB 2012 meeting will take place at the Ronald Reagan Building on historic Pennsylvania Avenue in the heart of Washington, DC.

The venue is less than a 10 minute walk (6 blocks) from the conference hotel. Both the hotel (Metro Center station) and the venue (Federal Triangle Station) are directly on the Blue and Orange Metro Lines (one stop from the hotel to the metro), and both facilities provide direct access to the metro station from within their buildings.

IMPORTANT: Please note that the Ronald Reagan Building is a U.S. government facility. As you enter, you will be asked to pass through metal detectors and show a picture ID. It is critical that you carry your picture ID (drivers license or passport) with you during the conference period.


The 23rd Annual ASC Conference is an excellent opportunity for you to:

Just off the Press

- ⇔ Herman Aguinis (Indiana University, USA) published the third edition of his book titled Performance Management (Pearson, ISBN: 978-0132556385). This book is about how to design and implement successful performance management systems that align individual, team, and organizational goals. Drawing on theories originating in human resource management, strategic management, cross-cultural psychology, and organizational behavior, among others, the book addresses both domestic and global performance management systems. Rather than having separate chapter(s), the book integrates international issues throughout. Among many topics particularly relevant for international business, the book describes the pervasiveness of performance management systems around the world and in specific regions (e.g., Asia, Latin America, Europe) and countries (e.g., Barbados, China, Korea, Brazil, India, Australia, Ghana, Eritrea, Taiwan), the importance and benefits of providing effective feedback regardless of the nationality or cultural background of employees, and the importance and benefits of establishing coaching relationships based on trust, among others.
- □ Ilan Alon (Rollins College, USA), Donata Vianelli (Università degli Studi di Trieste, Italy) and Eugene Jaffe have co-authored Global Marketing: Contemporary Theory, Practice, and Cases (McGraw-Hill, ISBN: 978-0078029279). It is a "truly global" textbook written by three authors who not only live in different areas of the world, the United States, Europe and Israel, but also have extensive international teaching and consulting experiences.
- Chris Brewster (University of Reading, United Kingdom) and Wolfgang Mayrhofer (WU Vienna, Austria) have published A Hand-

- book of Research into Comparative Human Resource Management (Edward Elgar, ISBN: 978-1847207265). This is the first book dedicated to the subject of comparative HRM and brings together over 60 outstanding scholars from all corners of the world to examine the concepts and the issues raised by such an approach to HRM and then explores the way that the topic is viewed in all the different regions of the world.
- Deborah E. De Lange (Memorial University, Canada) has published Cliques and Capitalism: A Modern Networked Theory of the Firm (Palgrave Macmillan, ISBN: 978-0230114548). The author suggests a new contextually linked building block model to develop theories of the firm in the field of strategy and organizations. Using this approach, she proposes two models: one that is a realistic American version and another that is a futuristic sustainable model. Both are new networked models that integrate current theories; a review of international corporate governance supports the sustainable firm that solves problems of the current one. Through a revised theoretical lens, the book answers a provocative question surrounding modern corporate America: Who wields the power? In this investigative look at the institutional mechanisms behind who is truly running the show, Cliques and Capitalism seeks to not only explain why the current corporate system fails to function well, but also offers solutions for improved corporate governance through a new sustainable model.
- Betty Jane Punnett (University of West Indies, Barbados) has published *Management:* A Developing Country Perspective (Routledge, ISBN: 978-0415590693). The global business world appears to be changing and there is an ever greater focus on developing countries. This change in the international business

environment is not reflected in the range of management textbooks currently available, as most are written from a developed country perspective. This book introduces and assesses the typical theories and management approaches that are popular in developed countries, from the perspective of managers in developing countries. A wide variety of countries, with many different environments and cultures are explored and the book covers key concepts, such as economic development; planning and strategic management; operations management; HRM; leadership. With the added benefit of various pedagogical features and supplementary web materials, students taking classes requiring an understanding of management concepts will find this book adds serious value. - Sarl P. Sauvant (Columbia University, USA) has edited the Yearbook on International Investment Law and Policy 2010-2011 (Oxford University Press, ISBN: 978-0199812356). The Investment Yearbook is an annual, peerreviewed publication, now in its third edition. It addresses current developments and salient trends in international investment law and policy. The present volume includes a Symposium on the new EU competence over investment, as well as chapters addressing such central issues as essential security clauses, climate change law, land acquisitions, State-controlled entities, and third-party funding, while examining the importance and relevance of dispute settlement within the current regime. It concludes with a debate on quantitative methods in research in international investment law. The table of contents is available at www.vcc.columbia.edu/vearbook.
- ⇔ Brenda Sternquist (Michigan State University, USA) has published Retail Strategic Internationalization (SIRE2) Theory and Cases (Brenda Sternquist Consulting, ISBN: 978-0982726006). Who, what, where and why retailers internationalize is the theme of this book. The SIRE2 model is presented

complete with propositions to predict international expansion for two types of retailers, global versus multinational. Global retailers internationalize using a standard format that they replicate wherever they go. Multinational retailers change their offering, adapting to different cultures and economies. Eighteen detailed cases are presented outlining retailers' international expansion strategy. Cases include Amazon.com, Blockbuster, Carrefour, Casino, Costco Wholesale, Foot Locker, Gap, Kingfisher, Metro, Office Depot, Pinaulat-Printemps-Redoute, Seven and I, Shoprite Holdings, Starbucks Coffee, Tesco, Toys R Us, Uniglo and Wal-Mart. Read their story and learn their strategy.

Theories that explain who, what, where and why retailers internationalize is the theme of this book. Sternquist's new Strategic International Retail Expansion Model SIRE3 model is presented complete with propositions to predict international expansion for two types of retailers, global versus multinational. Global retailers internationalize using a standard format that they replicate wherever they go. Multinational retailers change teir offering, adapting to different cultures and economies. Eleven chapters are presented outlining theories to explain various elements of retailers' international expansion. Chapters cover entry mode, global retailers' use of network advantages, born global retailers' internationalization, private label influences on internationalization, corporate branding and entry mode, longevity of international joint ventures and a special industry application of internationalization of hospitals.
